SUBJECT: Quarterly GM Report

The following is a highlight of the more significant activities that occurred during the third quarter (July, August, and September) of the calendar year 2018.

Operations

All treatment facilities continue to perform as expected. The total wastewater processed during the quarter was 0.99 billion gallons. The plant was 100% compliant with discharge regulations prescribed by the National Pollution Elimination System (NPDES) Permit and there were no Sanitary Sewer Overflows.

Biosolids Management

Organic Materials Recovery Center (OMRC)

Lystek continues to market services and has recently added contracts to process biosolids from the City of Benicia and the City of Palo Alto. District and Lystek staff continue to track progress towards organics regulations resulting from the passage of SB1383. To comply with these new regulations, many new organics processing facilities will be needed. The District and Lystek can be solution providers and staff from both facilities are active in regulatory development.

Engineering

Blower Replacement Project

In November 2017, the District Board approved a construction services contract with C.Overaa & Co. to replace aging aeration equipment and improve the reliability and efficiency of the system. Construction is underway, and the contract completion date is October 18, 2019.

Coating Rehabilitation Project

The second re-coating work on the steel Secondary Clarifier mechanisms started and is expected to be complete in late-summer to fall 2018.

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Plant Electrical Replacement Project

The District has been experiencing a higher frequency of breakdowns in electrical components. Many of these components have been installed for more than 30 years. The condition, age, and outdated technology warranted an electrical system assessment that is in progress. A design services contract was approved in June 2018 and work has begun.

Other Projects and activities:

- The roofing rehabilitation and/or replacement was completed on the Administration Building, Energy Recovery Building, and Suisun Pump Station.
- Continued work with Lystek on the recycling of their product to the District digesters to improve gas production and solids reduction. Lystek is upgrading their facilities to accept un-digested solids from the City of Palo Alto treatment plant.
- The 2018 plant paving work is expected to be completed by October 31, 2018. Several areas around the plant were repaired and coated to extend the useful life.
- An RFP has been issued for the predesign and design of improvements to Digester No. 2. Proposals are due November 9, 2018.
- Explored upgrading facility signs to provide better instructions for outside deliveries, contractors, and visitors.

Budget Analysis

The June 30, 2018 data in the attached tables are preliminary (prior to current year accruals). Overall expenses and revenues are within budget, with the following exceptions:

Expenses:

Revenues:

As observed in table 2 Capacity Fee Revenue continues to be less than projected due to
the timing of development projects. Budget projections were based on forecasts provided
by the cities. More permits are expected to be issued and capacity fees collected in FY
18/19. Projects funded through capacity fee revenue are timed to offset the impacts of
development. As development increases, so will capacity fee revenue to pay for the
capacity-fee-funded projects.

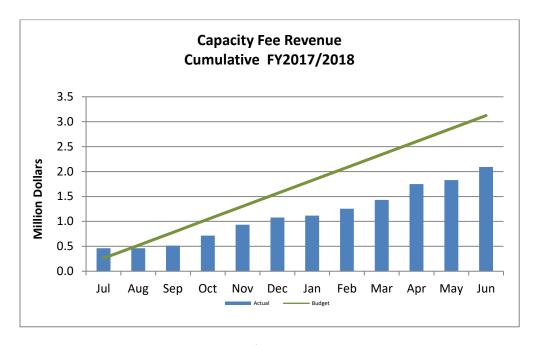

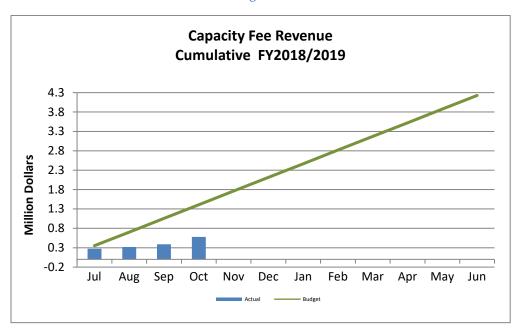

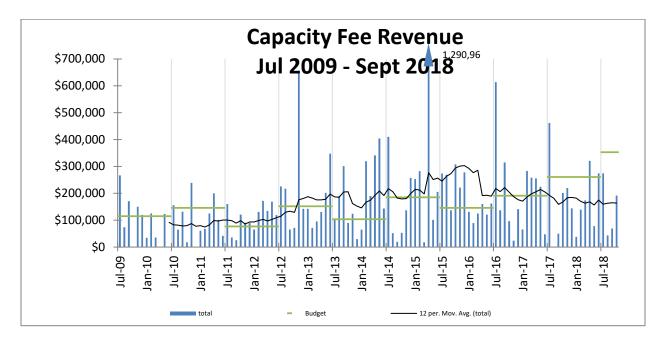
